

## Overkrill tied by Peter Hughebaert



### Materials

- **Hook** – Mustad C4750 D #4
- **Thread** – pink
- **Ribbing** –Varnished small silver tinsel ( resists corrosion)
- **Tail** –fluorescent pink polar bear
- **Body** –medium fluorescent pink pearl chenille
- **Shellback** –fluorescent pink lazer wrap
- **Eyes** – black on red stick-on eyes

### Tying Instructions

- Tie pink base
- Tie in tinsel
- Tie tail an top of hook, then splayed at bend of hook

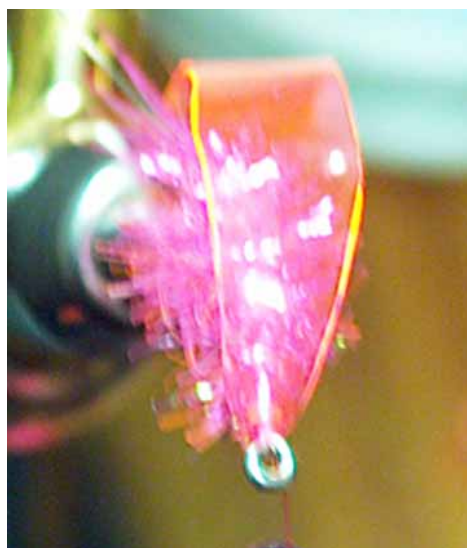


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- Tie in chenille  $\frac{2}{3}$  up hook, wind back and forward, thickest at the back and taper to front. Leave a lot of room at eye. Trim top with scissors to facilitate placing the shellback.



- Tie in shellback at the eye, size it to the fly and taper tip (see **dying scud**) Tie in evenly and balanced.



- Pull shellback back firmly and use tinsel to secure it ( see **Sparkle Shrimp**) and then rib evenly to front.
- Build head up and whip finish

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- Fold shellback evenly over bend of hook and cut a vee to form a telson. Cut with scissors slanting down and away from the back of the hook.
- Stick on eyes (optional)



The overkrill is an effective Pink Salmon fly.
