Some say that they are "just late. However last fall Fed Fish was cautioning about the possible effects that the west coast "warm water blob' may have on the returns for this year. It was their concern that because of the lack of feed in the blob and its size, that many out-going fry (Pinks and Chum) as well as

smolts (Chinook, coho, sockeye) could have starved to death which would mean a diminished return for returning Pinks in 2016.

I guess that only time will tell.
