

Fishing Report from Kamloops area

Just got back from a great trip up to the interior. We (Wayne and I) stayed with older brother David and fished Morgan and Six Mile (Pat) Lake which are only a half hour or so from David's place.

but managed to fish through it and get some good days in. The last three days were cold in the morning but really pleasant in the afternoon. Morgan was a bit of a disappointment after our stellar fishing there in the spring. We caught good numbers of trout but none of the huge ones

we encountered in the Spring. (The biggest were 18 and 20 inches). Six Mile was a pleasant

surprise . . . fishing improved (or we learned the layout of the lake) daily with the last day of the trip reminiscent of a day on Panther with fish numbers and fish activity (most of the fish were Pennask strain and outfought the Morgan fish hands down) but these fish reached sizes up to 20 inches with 16 inches being the average size.

Best flies on both lakes seemed to be dark leeches or micro leeches. Morgan produced well for
