

Kissinger Lake March 29

Air temperature was a cool 6° in the morning upon arrival, with favourable winds out of the west at only 5 knots and mostly sunny skies.



Other than one young couple sitting by the lake drinking Luckys at 10:30 AM, I had the lake all to myself. Initially, I had a couple of hook ups over by the east side of the lake near the weed beds. I was using a

number six rod with a floating line and sink tip with a 3 foot leader. The #10 gold bead head rolled muddler (with red gills showing) seemed to be doing the trick when slow trolled behind the boat.

After lunch I tried trolling along the far southern shore particularly near a leaning cedar tree and was able to bring four more fish to the boat, with the same muddler fly. Most seemed in the 10 inch range but 2 were 12 inches which I kept for dinner.



The beer drinkers had left by now and I truly had the whole lake to myself, it was a splendid afternoon.

Returned home via the Southern Road which was a big mistake as it is in very bad shape with huge potholes and lots of mud, would recommend the North Shore Youbou access.
