Cathy's Coat

"September and October in the Pacific Northwest mean pink and coho salmon beach fishing. Cathy's Coat has proven to be a reliable standard for both these species on the beach."

MATERIALS

Hook: Mustad 34011 #4 - 6

Thread: Red monocord

Tail: Pink polar bear or bucktail

Body: Florescent red Lazer Wrap over flat silver tinsel

Rib: None

Beard: Pink Krystal Flash

Wing: 50/50 white and pink polar bear or bucktail with a few strands of pink Krystal Flash

TYING STEPS

- 1. Wrap on tying thread at the eye of the hook. Wind down to the butt.
- 2. Secure the pink polar bear tail in place.
- 3. Secure a 1/4 inch wide length of Lazer Wrap to the butt and then tie the tinsel in place at the butt. Wrap the thread back to the head of the fly.
- 4. Wrap the tinsel forward making an even body and tie off.
- 5. Wrap the Lazer Wrap forward, overlapping each wrap by about ?of the width of the material, making an even body and tie off.
- 6. Tie in a beard of pink Krystal Flash, hook point length. Trim excess.
- 7. Tie in a clump of polar bear consisting of 50% white and 50% pink hairs. Before tying them in, roll the mixture between your fingers several times to mix the fibres together. Tie in the fibres at the head, and trim the excess.
- 8. Tie in about 4 6 strands of pink Krystal Flash as an overwing. Cut off excess.
- 9. Whip finish the head and cement.
