Summer Barbecue



Gerry Stevens thanked all who had helped him out when he had transmission trouble at the Stella Lake Fishout. He also mentioned that the fly fishing casting and demo at the Nanaimo River Hatchery was quite successful.



During the "Gilly", Doug Peterson told us about how he had to assist this older, fairly feeble gentleman with untanglingling his even older equipment at Westwood Lake. The last laugh was on Doug when this same gentleman told him an hour later that he was going to shore because he already had his limit of four trout.

Guest Speaker, Harlan Wright graduated from the Fisheries and Aquaculture Program, Malaspina college, in 1998 as a Fisheries Technician and has been working for the British Columbia Conservation Foundation. He has been doing the steelhead stock assessment and habitat restoration on Vancouver Island streams for the last six years. In addition, Harlan is a keen steelhead, trout, and salmon fly fisher.

Harlan's gave us a slide presentation on the work that has been done by the Greater Georgia Basin Steelhead Recovery Plan (GGBSRP). They have been doing fish count surveys, habitat restoration and carcass plantings. Last year they snorkel surveyed 248 km of streams and counted 724 steelhead. This is only 4 per km. At one time it was 60 per km. and 20 per km. is deemed to be satisfactory. Although many of the streams (especially in the southern half of Vancouver Island) are in trouble, these programs, plus their habitat restoration program, should go a long way to improve the populations of steelhead and other salmon.

Harlan emphasized the need for more volunteers to help out with their many worthy programs. One of these is the work organized by David Clough (390-2901) to move trapped fry from isolated pools in the Englishman River during low water starting in June. This looks like a good project for us. 

PETER'S NEEDLE FISH



Doug Peterson was so impressed by this fly, which was demonstrated by Peter Huyghebaert at the May fly tying class, that he had to write it up.

Materials:

Hook: Size 6 -10 Stainless 3X (Mustad 34011

or S74S SS) Thread: Red. 8/0

Tail: Silver angel hair (Polar Ice)

Body: Krystal flash pearlescent, dark blue and

dark green

Eyes: Prismatic Stick-ons 2mm eyes (green or

yellow background)

Epoxy: Slow setting and 5 Minute Epoxy

Procedure:

Tie in 5 turns of thread above point of hook.

Tie in white angel hair (length of shaft) for tail.

Tie off, cement.

Tie in 5 turns at eve.

Tie in all Krystal flash in the forward position with the pearlescent tied on bottom of hook (5 or 6 strands) and the blue tied on top, (5 or 6 strands).

Keep thread layers on top of each other for a base for the eves later.

Tie in the green Krystal Flash on the sides, (3 strands each side).

Tie off and cement.

Retie above point.

Connect the pearlescent on the bottom, leave the long strands as long as the tail.

Connect the blue on top and cut off at the tie.

Connect one side of the green, then the other, cutting off at the tie.

Tie off and cement.

Connect eyes and use small amount of 5 minute epoxy on top and bottom of eyes to secure.

Use slow drying epoxy to form the body, dry on a rotating dryer.

Use for pink and coho salmon. Use jerky retrieve to imitate fish escaping from predator
